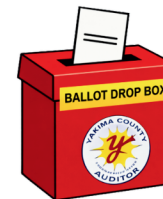

Can I register?

You must be:

- 1 at least 18 years old to vote
- 2 a U.S citizen
- 3 a resident of WA State
- 4 not disqualified from voting due to a court order
- 5 not currently serving a sentence of total confinement in prison for a felony

If you are 16–17:

- sign up now
- automatically registered at 18

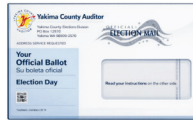

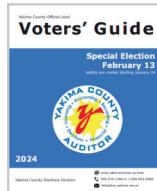
Turning 18 by the November Election?

What happens next?



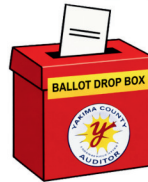
You'll receive your ballot by mail 18 days before Election Day

Mailing your ballot?

Mail your ballot early to make sure it's on time or return it to an official drop box by 8 p.m. Election Day.

Check your ballot status in 3 easy steps

- 1 Go to VoteWA.gov
- 2 Enter your information
- 3 View your ballot status

Was your ballot rejected?

If your ballot status is rejected / challenged, don't worry, you can still "cure" your ballot, so it counts.

How to fix it:

- Follow the instructions on the form we mailed you.
- Sign and return the form.
- If you did not receive one in the mail, visit our website for a cure form or call us for help.
